PRAIRIE GIRL BAKERY

Just follow the trail of frosting-tipped noses to the hard-to-find entrance to this colourful cupcake shop (it's a King Street address, but the front door is around the corner on Victoria). The prairie girl in question is Saskatchewan-born Jean Blacklock, who delivers the quality of a top pâtisserie with the efficiency of a Tim Hortons. All-natural cupcakes are available in mini and regular sizes (mini \$1.75; regular \$2.95)—no fluorescent, artificially flavoured icing here—and come in a wide variety of combinations that might include buttermilk cake with tangy chocolate-cream cheese icing, or banana cake with peanut-butter icing. Gluten-free cupcakes made with chickpea flour, sorghum and rice flours (mini \$2.75; regular \$3.95) are also available. *18 King St. E. (at Victoria St.), Unit 106, 416-504-2253.*
